

Covid-19: Your Rights While Shopping.

According to Regulation 6(2)(a) of the Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England) Regulations 2020, <u>you are permitted</u> to leave the house to:

- "obtain basic necessities, <u>including food</u> and medical supplies for those in the same household"
- this includes "any pets or animals in the household"
- you are also allowed to purchase items "for the essential upkeep, maintenance and functioning of the household", and to withdraw money

There is <u>no restriction on what type of food you are allowed to buy</u>.

There is <u>no list of 'essential food items'</u>. Food in general is classed as a basic necessity.

There is nothing to suggest that police are permitted to monitor your shopping.

BYSTANDERS:

If somebody is being unfairly targeted, help them! Record video, stand where they (& the police) can see you, ask what rules they've broken. Remember to stay safe & practice social distancing.

If you get issued with a fixed penalty notice under any of these regulations, Regulation 10 stipulates that:

- it has to be £60 (if it's your 1st one)
- they have to give you 28 days to pay it
